## Miron Construction gets nod for biofuels plant with Flambeau River Biofuels

Town of Menasha-based Miron Construction was formally picked to help erect the largest second generation "green diesel" plant in the United States.

Flambeau River Biofuels today announced it executed a letter that sets the stage for Miron and AMEC, an international engineering and project management firm, to put up the \$250 million plant at Flambeau's Park Falls pulp and paper mill.

Miron has been working with Flambeau for two years to help develop the project, said David Voss, president of Miron, in a statement.

Butch Johnson, majority owner of Flambeau River Papers and Flambeau River Biofuels, said the AMEC-Miron team was picked for its experience and innovation in developing green energy and biofuel facilities.

The plant, expected to be fully operational in 2013, will use a patented process to convert 1,000 dry tons per day of woody biomass from bark, sawdust, wood and forest residue into so-called green electrical power, steam and heat to the adjacent paper making operation, along with diesel fuel and wax for domestic markets.
